Indian Institute of Soil and Water Conservation Research Centre, Datia (MP)

Brief description of the activity:

1. Community Participation

Under the Swachhata Pakhwada being observed from 16 to 31 December, the ICAR – Indian Institute of Soil and Water Conservation, Research Centre, Datia organized a community-level sanitation awareness programme on 22 December 2025 at Village Murera, District Datia (M.P.). The programme was conducted with the objective of implementing sanitation activities in an effective, systematic, and sustainable manner while ensuring active public participation. The primary objective of the programme was to sensitize villagers about the importance of cleanliness and encourage them to become active partners in the creation of a clean, healthy, and self-reliant environment.

During the programme, residents of local habitations were actively involved in sanitation-related activities so that cleanliness could be promoted not merely as a formal campaign, but as a people's movement. Keeping in view the social structure of the village, the activities were carried out in a planned and participatory manner to ensure maximum community involvement. To disseminate the importance of cleanliness among all sections of society, active participation of various community groups such as women groups, youth, senior citizens, and other aware villagers was ensured. Villagers were provided detailed information on personal hygiene, household sanitation, community cleanliness, and the maintenance of cleanliness in public places. Emphasis was also laid on avoiding open dumping of waste, preventing diseases caused by unhygienic conditions, and understanding the health benefits of a clean environment. To further strengthen community participation, village-level interactions and counseling activities were organized, through which villagers were motivated to adopt cleanliness as an integral part of their daily lives. They were made aware that cleanliness is not the responsibility of any single institution or department, but a collective responsibility of every citizen. As a result, a positive change in attitude and behavior toward sanitation was observed among the villagers.

2. Signature Campaign

In this sequence, a **Signature Campaign** was launched to formally record the commitment of citizens toward cleanliness. Under this campaign, a total of 60 villagers from Village Murera took a pledge to

maintain cleanliness, keep public places clean, and motivate others to adopt hygienic practices. Through this initiative, villagers accepted their responsibility toward cleanliness in written form, which helped in developing a sense of ownership and accountability.

During the signature campaign, interactions were held with villagers to make them aware of waste management practices, segregation of wet and dry waste, use of safe drinking water, and the importance of maintaining a clean environment. This initiative enhanced awareness regarding sanitation and strengthened the collective resolve to keep the village clean through joint efforts.

The successful organization and implementation of the programme were made possible through the significant contributions of the officers and staff of ICAR-IISWC, Research Centre, Datia. Dr. Kripa Shankar Maurya, Scientist, provided conceptualization, planning, and technical guidance for the programme and sensitized villagers on the scientific, health, and environmental aspects of sanitation. Shri Bhagwan Das Kushwaha, Senior Technical Officer, played an important role in coordination, smooth execution of field activities, and ensuring community participation. Shri Deepak Maurya, Senior Technical Assistant, actively contributed to organizing the signature campaign, registration of villagers, conduct of awareness activities, and logistical support. Shri Gautam Singh, Senior Technical Assistant, played a key role in village-level outreach, mobilizing villagers, and effective dissemination of sanitation-related messages.

Number of participants - 60

Program Outcome: Overall, the coordinated efforts of all officers and staff resulted in a significant increase in sanitation awareness in Village Murera. A positive mindset toward cleanliness was developed among the villagers, and a meaningful and sustainable initiative was undertaken toward the creation of a clean, healthy, and hygienic environment.

Indian Institute of Soil Science, Bhopal

Indian Institute of Water Management, Bhubaneswar

On Day-7 of the on-going Swachhta Pakhwada i.e., on 22nd December 2025, a swachhta programme involving community and village leaders was organized in Kulantira(sasan) Village in Balipatna block of Khordha district. At the outset, the participants were administered swachhta pledge and then sensitized about objectives of and progress under *Swachh Bharat Abhiyan* such as making Indian villages open defecation free, sharp decline in incidences of diarrhoea and other gastro-related diseases, converting wastes to wealth and plantation waste treatment, increased area under plantation and developing clean common/tourist places. Green Drive and Plantation Drive

Under the banner of Swachhta Pakhwada during 16 December to 31 December, 2025, one Green Drive and Plantation Drive campaign was organized on 20.12.2025 at ICAR-CAZRI Colony campus. The campaign was structured around two pillars: Waste Management and Resource Conservation. The goal was to shift environmental responsibility from a "government task" to a "household habit." Elimination of Single- Use Plastics: Educating residents on the long-term hazards of non-biodegradable waste.

Water Stewardship: Promoting the dual strategy of harvesting rainwater and recycling "grey-water" (household wastewater) for functional use. Biodiversity: Enhancing the local ecosystem through physical plantation. On this occasion CAZRI employees, residential of CAZRI colony gathered in the morning at 9.00 am in the park of the CAZRI Colony. The pragramme started with welcome by Dr. Aman Varma, Scientist. Dr. Reena Rani, Scientist gave detailed talk about how we can minimize the use of plastic in our day to day life, social functions and celebrations otherwise which creates tones of plastic wastes. Dr. Reena Rani introduced a specific version of the 3R principle tailored for plastic waste 1. Reduce: Minimizing intake by choosing alternatives (e.g., cloth bags, glass bottles) during social functions and daily life., 2. Recollect: Ensuring that plastic already in use doesn't enter landfills or oceans, but is instead gathered for processing. And 3. Recycle: Transforming collected waste into new products to reduce the need for "virgin" plastic production. This framework is essential for moving toward a "Circular Economy" where materials never become trash. by which we can make our planet green. Dr. Aman Verma emphasized to reduce use of water and recycle of waste water to be used in various activities like gardening, flushing and washing. It was also suggested That Rain water should also be collected and used in kitchen gardens. The event transitioned from theory to practice through high-level endorsements and physical activity: The "Home-First" Philosophy: Dr. P. Santra (Acting Director) emphasized a bottom-up approach. He

argued that national cleanliness is an aggregate of individual household habits. If a drive starts at home, it naturally scales to the colony and eventually the nation. After this awareness programme a plantation drive was also launched in CAZRI Colony capus by planting a tree in the corner of CAZRI Park. This serves as a "living" reminder of the commitment made by the residents and adds to the green cover of the CAZRI campus. The programme ended with thanks to Director, CAZRI, and all participants.

Horticulture Division

Directorate of Cashew Research, Pune

Given the market's role in ensuring food security and supporting livelihoods across Northeast India, the visit focused on maintaining the integrity of this essential supply chain. **Dr. Martin Xavier**, Senior Scientist held discussions with market authorities regarding infrastructure improvements and quality control. By identifying current gaps, the team suggested specific interventions to enhance hygiene and marketing practices in line with **Swachhata** goals.

Number of Participants: 10 officials and 10 Jagiroad marketing functionaries

Kev Outcomes:

1. Hygiene & Sanitation Mapping: The meeting successfully pinpointed specific areas where the "Swachhata" (cleanliness) standards were lacking, particularly in the storage and open-air display of dried fish.

Suggestions

- Improved raised platforms for display to prevent floor-level contamination.
- Enhanced ventilation and moisture control in storage warehouses.
- Implementation of **better packaging solutions** to increase the shelf life of the dry fish.
- 2.**Logistical Assessment:** Officials and scientists identified bottlenecks in the current supply chain that lead to physical damage or contamination of the products during transit and marketing.
- 3.**Policy Support:** The discussion paved the way for potential funding or technical support from the NFDB (National Fisheries Development Board) to implement these infrastructural upgrades.



Central Inland Fisheries Research Institute, Barrackpore

On the 7th day of Swachhata Pakhwada 2025, ICAR–Central Inland Fisheries Research Institute (ICAR-CIFRI), Barrackpore, organized swachhata awareness at Rishra Ghat.
