Collapse of newly built highways in Eastern India

- (a) whether Government are seized of the incidents of portions of newly-built highways under the Golden Quadrilateral Project (GQP) caving in certain parts of eastern India, in particular;
 - (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) whether it is a fact that NHAI has adopted uniform technical parameters for laying roads under the GQP throughout the country in disregard to the varied geological formations and soil texture prevailing in different parts;
 - (d) if so, the rationale therefor;
- (e) whether any investigation into the reasons for collapse of sections of GQP highways have been carried out and accountability fixed; and
 - (f) if so, the details thereof?

Setting up of Indian Maritime Service Cadre
