Production of sugar

- †*161. SHRI ABU ASIM AZMI: Will the Minister of CONSUMER AFFAIRS, FOOD AND PUBLIC DISTRIBUTION be pleased to state:
- (a) the total production of sugar in the country during 2003-04 and to what extent this is less in comparison to last year's production;
- (b) whether Government propose to import sugar keeping in view the less production of sugar; if not, the reasons therefor; and
- (c) the steps being taken by Government to increase the production for striking a balance between consumption of sugar and the prices?

Expansion of game sanctuaries

- *162. SHRI S.M. LALJAN BASHA: Will the Minister of ENVIRONMENT AND FORESTS be pleased to state:
- (a) whether Government propose to extend the land area under game sanctuaries by buying up adjacent land;
 - (b) whether it is a fact that there is a

need to extend the area reserved for game sanctuaries;

- (c) whether any plan is under consideration of Government to help State Governments acquire nearby land to sanctuaries;
 - (d) if so, the details of such plans; and
- (e) the States which have been selected for this purpose?

Broad gauge line in Lumding-Silchar sector

Telephonic railway enquiry service
