Ash emitted by Thermal Power Stations

- (a) whether Government's attention has been drawn to the likelihood of change in local ecology due to the ash emitted by thermal power stations in the country;
- (b) if so, the quantity of ash emitted by each Thermal Power Station in the country at present;
- (c) the manner in which the ash is being disposed off by these Thermal Power Stations; and
- (d) the manner in which Government propose to deal with the hazards arising from this ash?

Tax waiver policy for Naphtha-based power projects

*402. SHRI GHULAM NABI AZAD: Will the Minister of POWER be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government have decided to extend the tax waiver policy, available to upcoming private power projects to Naphtha-based power projects, some of the State-run units and also to NTPCs five Naphtha-based combine cycle plants;

- (c) if so, to what extent it has been helpful for the State-run units?
