Right to food for children

*521. SHRI B.K. HARIPRASAD: Will the Minister of WOMEN AND CHILD DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether an All-India Convention was held recently in Hyderabad on 'Children's Right to Food' examining the role of the Integrated Child Development Scheme;
- (b) whether the Convention has called for universalisation with quality of the ICDS and strengthening of the Aanganwadi network; and
- (c) the other salient findings of the Convention which are being considered by Government for early implementation?

Expansion of school education system
