Credit rating system for small and medium scale enterprises

*21. SHRI JESUDASU SEELAM: DR. T. SUBBARAMI REDDY:

Will the Minister of FINANCE be pleased to state:

- (a) whether he has launched the first credit rating system for small and medium scale enterprises;
- (b) if so, whether the move is aimed at ensuring higher availability of bank and institutional credit to the small and medium enterprises sector;
- (c) whether the nodal agency for the project would be the National Small Industries Corporation; and
- (d) if so, to what extent this rating system has been helpful for the small and medium enterprises?

Establishment of repair facilities

- *22. SHRI B.K. HARIPRASAD: Will the Minister of CIVIL AVIATION be pleased to state:
- (a) whether as a pre-condition to placement of orders for Boeing/Airbus, India has sought foreign investment in

civil aviation sector by establishing repair overhaul and maintenance facilities in India;

- (b) whether Boeing Airplane Co. and Airbus Industrie have committed to invest around Rs. 1,000.00 crores on Indian facilities for maintenance, repair and overhaul of their aircrafts in India; and
- (c) whether around 150 Boeing aircrafts are expected to be inducted by the Indian carriers over the next three years and if so, whether financial viability of establishing an MRO venture in India has been confirmed?

- (c) whether this scheme is getting aid from Indo-German Bilateral Development Co-operative through its various schemes?

Committee to advise in cases against companies

Deduction of TDS from hospitals/ nursing homes

Crop insurance scheme for Orissa

- (d) the new long term power policy, if any, evolved?

- (d) whether he had also discussions regarding route of pipeline and transit fee with Pakistan; and
- (e) if so, whether on this issue also final agreement has been reached?

Off-loading of shares of BHEL

- (a) whether Government have recently decided to off-load 10 per cent of its share in Bharat Heavy Electricals Ltd.;

- (c) the amount likely to be raised from this sell off and how the proceeds would be utilized?

Bio-diesel fund

- (b) if so, whether expert group has stated that any decision to reduce Government's equity to less than 51 per cent in navratnas, miniratnas and public sector enterprises with a three years profit making record should be taken only with the consent of the Parliament; and
- (c) if so, what are the other steps Sengupta's panel has suggested and how its recommendations have been accepted?

Revenue earned by oil refineries

- (c) the details of revenue, such productions at the refineries yielded to Government;
- (d) the details of revisions of selling prices of these by-products effected by these refineries from time to time; and
- (e) price revision on each occasion was attributable to what?
